Kaizen Dojo Kyokushinkai It has been an exciting time for our club, with the launch of our first junior dojo in Altona North. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Shihan Doug, Sensei Shah and Senpai Jenny for all their help and support with the set up and successful establishment of the Associations first club in Victoria.

Over the past two months we have been running classes for children aged 5 to 12 years old at the Walker Close Community Centre on Millers Road on Monday and Wednesday evenings. We have had plenty of interest and support from local schools, parents, students and friends. We are looking forward to continued growth during the second half of the year.

As part of our growth strategy we are working with the Phoenix Youth Centre in Buckley Street, Footscray to broaden our offering to provide classes to teenagers and adults aged 12 to 25 years old. Classes will commence on Monday 23rd of July and run from 5:15pm to 6:30pm. A copy of the flyer is below for your reference. So if you are in town and interested in training please feel free to visit and train with us.

About Senpai Marcel Saunders (1st Dan) Following in his father's footsteps, Senpai Marcel started his training as a junior at age 5 in Geelong under the then Sensei Gary Vickars, where he achieved a grade of 3rd Kyu before he was ten years old. A noticeable achievement during this time was performing an outstanding demonstration in 1982 Australian Kvokushinkai Open Full Contact Karate Tournament. After many years away from martial arts, he resumed his training in London at the Haringey Kyokushinkai Karate (HKK) Dojo under Sensei Savio Santimano. He was part of HKK team that fought in the 2009 British Kyokushinkai Karate Regional Knockdown Championships and was award 1st place in the Men's Novice Lightweight Division. He passed his Shodan (black belt) in 2010 and was graded by Hanshi Steve Arneil. Being based in the UK for over 6 years Marcel was fortunate to have the opportunity to attend a number of instructor courses and training camps. During this time in London, Marcel trained with leading instructors in the IFK and BKK including Hanshi Steve Arneil, Shihan Liam Keaveney, and other of his distinguished instructors. In 2011 Marcel and his family migrated back to Australia and in 2012 he founded the Kaizen Dojo (Kyokushinkai).

The Japanese word kaizen means "Improvement, Betterment; Incremental and continuous improvement." When applied to Kyokushinkai karate, the martial way, the budo way, it means that each karate-ka (student) should follow the path of determined self improvement through hard training which tests their minds, body and spirit and leads towards the ultimate truth.

General information for gradings the next junior grading for Sydney will be held in the first week of September and the next senior grading will be held on Sunday 30th September.

Junior grading are for students attempting grades up to an including 5^{th} Kyu. Senior grading are for students attempting 4^{th} kyu and higher. Please note if you are anticipating attending a senior grading your grading application must be submitted to your instructor minimum of 3 months prior for all grades up to 1 kyu and black belt applications must be submitted 6 months prior depending on the grade and must have the support of your instructor. For all senior grades-please ensure you have or are in the process of meeting the requirements for the stated grading. Check your syllabus for details.

Note: you are invited to grade, it is not an automatic right, hours of attendance are not the only prerequisite, talk to your instructor to be sure you are on track for your next grading.

The 4th IFK World Tournament England 6th-7th of April 2013



The 4th IFK World Tournament will be taking place on 6th-7th of April 2013. This is full-contact event only. It will be a combined tournament, incorporating both the Adult tournament, and another Junior tournament (16-17yrs only) like the one Senpai Tony Le competed at in 2011. There will be three weight categories for males and 2 for females in each tournament. Details to come later. If you would like to be considered for the Australian Team selection for this event please talk to your instructor and be prepared for a lot of hard work in the coming months.

Kyokushin Belt colours

This information on Kyokushin Belt colours has been either paraphrased from Shihan Cameron Quinn's book the Budo Karate of Mas Oyama, or derived from the personal experience of Sensei Shaharin Yussof and can be found on the following web site: http://www.australiankyokushin.com/belts-meaning.htm

🗖 Blue — Fluidity and Adaptability

While the red belt aspects of training must be continued, now the karetaka begins to work on the upper body, strength, flexibility, and coordination. It is here that you learn to overcome the urge to "Take it easy", and if successful, training becomes a pleasure. The student begins to feel the benefits of training with an increased sense of well-being, a bigger bounce in ones step, and overall better fitness.

Here the karateka must start taking control of mind and body. This might take the form of not showing the pain of being hit during sparring, not showing exhaustion during training, not wiping the drop of sweat of one's nose because one hasn't yet been told to, not yawning despite extreme tiredness etc...

🗖 Yellow — Assertion

Here you learn to focus your power, by concentrating it on the *hara* (the general area of the lower abdomen) or even the *tanden* (the single point in the lower abdomen that more or less is located at the centre of gravity of the body). Fortunately for most of us, this point is just behind where we tie the knot of our belts.

This is the first level where training begins to concentrate the psychological aspects of training, with an emphasis on mind-body

coordination. It is here that the karateka must begin to develop both power and speed when performing techniques. The yellow belt is the last of the "raw beginner's" belts and the karateka begins to take control of his or her life, body, and environment.

You should also be familiar with dojo etiquette and setting a good example for the newer and / or younger students at this stage. If not, I suggest you read your student manual.
