Changes to Sydney Gradings for 2011

The IFKKA executive has introduced some changes for gradings in 2011, the gradings will usually run as outlined below and attendance is by invitation only.

Group 1 - Junior students aged up to 12 years - note a junior student is a student without grade (e.g. white belt) up to and including 5th Kyu (yellow belt with 1 black tip). This grading will start at the earlier time of 5.30pm and finish at around 7pm. Some students will be advised to attend the later grading due to age, stature and grade applied for.

Group 2 -Junior students aged over 12 years - no grade (white belt) up to and including 5th Kyu (yellow belt with 1 black tip) this grading will start at 7.15 and finish at around 9pmish.

Note: Groups 1 and 2 typically can grade if they qualify at quarterly intervals, e.g. March June, September and December

Group 3 - Senior grading, this grading caters to students of all ages grading for 4th (green belt) and higher. These gradings are usually held on a Sunday. Students in this group can typically grade twice per year in March & September, if they meet the grading pre-requisites

We welcome your feed back with regard to these changes. As in previous years there was always a concern with the younger students being out till 8.30pm. This is why we have split the age groups and moved the under 12yrs junior grading to 5.30pm.

Kyokushin Belt Colours

This information on Kyokushin Belt colours has been either paraphrased from Shihan Cameron Quinn's book the Budo Karate of Mas Oyama, or derived from the personal experience of Sensei Shaharin Yussof and can be found on the following web site http://www.australiankyokushin.com/belts-meaning.htm



White is the symbol of purity, at least in the English and Japanese based cultures. The new white belt student might be described as pure, being completely ignorant of the requirements of the art. The purity is lost as soon as the first exercise is performed in the dojo. The pristine colour is gone forever through sweat and dust, and the journey through the colour spectrum begins. There is no shame in being a white belt and the instructor, more than the others, is aware of this because he or she too was one once.

In the Honbu dojo in Japan, while under Mas Oyama, the tradition was that *uchi-deshi* (live-in or full-time students) wear white belts would shave their heads as a sign of their dedication. The third year *uchi-deshi*, newly graduated blackbelts, also did this to indicate humility, symbolising the return to the spirit of a beginner

🌃 Red — Stability

In the run-up to and throughout the red belt training, you develop the very basics of karate. You unlearn any ideas you had about how to fight, and you learn about your body. (Anyone who has been through this stage will tell you that this is where they learnt their body had muscles where they didn't even know they had places!) It is here too that you begin to develop a sense of balance and coordination between the various body parts, with an emphasis on stance. You should also be familiar with dojo etiquette at this stage. If not, I suggest you read your student manual.
